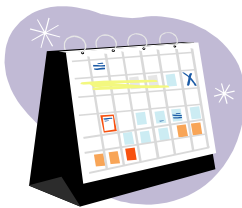

Youjung is a sophomore at Kamiak High School and has been active in the Key Club since her freshman year. She has emerged as an active participant and potential leader with a high work ethic; dedicated to the Key Club objectives of service to home, school and community.

Mrs. Reese, Key Club Advisor, states "Youjung was chosen due to her hard work on the *Earcandy project*. It was her idea and she put in long hours to make it happen. When we announced that she was *Student of the Month* she said it made her want to work harder. I would say that is what *Student of the Month* is all about. She more than deserves the honor." (The project, Mrs. Reese refers to, involves auditioning student- singers, songwriters and musicians to record their music. The resulting CDs will be sold to students, parents, friends and the general public. Payment can be made in the form of cash or cans of food. The "profits" will go to NW Harvest.)

Youjung maintains a 4 point GPA and has taken 9 Honors classes YTD projecting 17 by graduation. Her Class Standing is Number One in a class size of 595. Some of her other activities include *Student Council, Knights in Action, Math Club, Academic Coaches, Conflict Mediator and sixth grade activity club-teacher's helper.*

Brian Steves, music teacher and orchestra leader, remarked: "Youjung is a dedicated member of our top audition orchestra, *Philharmonic Strings*. Club Meetings & Administration:
