- Community Garden Proposal Members feedback requested

In 2009, a group of our Mukilteo residents, some who are Master Gardeners, organized the Mukilteo Community Garden Association to create a teaching garden that would provide opportunities for individuals and families to learn about good gardening practices, and to provide an opportunity to grow food for themselves and for the Mukilteo Food Bank. The City of Mukilteo partnered with Mukilteo Community Garden including allowing use of the City Property for the Garden, providing water connection and electricity.

It is envisioned that our Club would be a visible promoter of the garden, a source of individual volunteers and a contributor to at least one annual service project at or for the Garden.

Their request is for the Mukilteo Kiwanis Club adopt the Mukilteo Community Garden as a three-year service project. The commitment would involve club participation with other community groups, volunteers and the Mukilteo Community Garden non-profit organization in establishing and maintaining a Community Garden.

The Club would commit to:

- Appointing a Kiwanis Community Gardens Committee Chairperson
- Maintaining a liaison with the Mukilteo Community Gardens organization
- Informing Club members and Key and Builder Club advisors of opportunities to work at the garden
- Organize an annual club wide, work party at the garden
- Considering grants for garden improvements (Club budget permitting).
