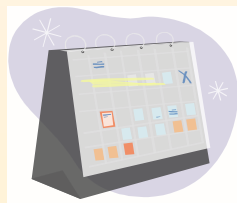

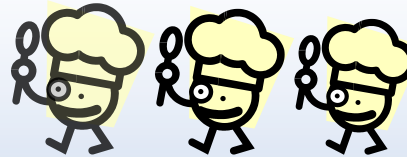

Dear PNW Kiwanians,

Just a quick note to let all of you know that our own Sylvester Neal was elected to the office of Vice President of Kiwanis International this at the 93rd Annual Kiwanis International Convention in Orlando, Florida this afternoon.

This win means that Sylvester will serve as International Vice President in 2008-2009, President-elect in 2009-2010 and as Kiwanis International President in 2010-2011! He will preside over the 96th Annual Kiwanis International Convention in Las Vegas, Nevada. That's within driving distance for most of us in the PNW -- so start making your plans now!

Reliable authorities tell us that Sylvester led the balloting after the first ballot this morning. As there was a field of five candidates, no candidate received the requisite fifty per cent plus one majority -- so a run-off election was held shortly after noon. Sylvester faced Joel Lee Williams of the Alabama District in the run-off.

Vote counting went very slow during the afternoon. Sylvester took the call informing him of his victory in the PNW Victory Party Room -- surrounded by some 200 PNW Kiwanians who went nuts when he confirmed that we were all looking at "the next Vice President of Kiwanis International."

Sylvester plans a Victory celebration at the District Convention this August in Kennewick, WA as he wants to thank all of the PNW Kiwanians who contributed to his victory in time, support and donations -- whether they were able to come to Orlando or not!
