Another Great Recipe from Char's Kitchen ...

A Great Summer Meal: Chicken Salad

3 cups chicken cut into 1/2 pieces
3 cups cantaloupe cut into 1/2 pcs
1 cup of thinly sliced celery
1/2 cup of scallions
2 cups of cashews

Dressing (This is the Best)

3/4 cup of vegetable oil
1/2 cup mango chutney
3 garlic cloves
1 Tablespoon Dijon Mustard
1 Tablespoon Soy Sauce
1 Tablespoon Dark Sesame Oil
3/4 Tablespoon Tabasco
Pour on salad just before serving.
Serves (6)

For Dessert:

Raspberry Shortcake Pie

1 cup frozen non dairy whipped
topping, thawed
1 jar (7oz) marshmallow cream
1 cup raspberry sherbet, softened
1 container (6oz) low fat raspberry
yogurt
1 cup of fresh or frozen raspberries
1 premade Shortbread Pie Crust
In medium bowl whisk together
topping and marshmallow cream
until combined. Gently stir in
sherbet and yogurt.

Place raspberries in crust. Spoon
whipped topping mixture over
raspberries. Freeze at least 4
hours or until firm.

Let stand at room temperature for
15 minutes before cutting. Garnish
as desired. Store in freezer.

Makes 8 servings. Prep time 10
minutes.

GREETINGS FROM THE FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

We have a new fund-raiser! The Marysville Kiwanis Club has five Fireworks booths in the greater Marysville area and have asked us to man one of them. They will set up the booth, stock it and we will have to man it with 2 people from June 28th to July 4th. The fireworks will be marked and we will have a debit card machine. All transactions are cash or card....no checks. We get 10% of the take and realistically that will be around \$2,000 to \$3,000. We need to have an RV on site in the evenings for security reasons. Our booth will be in front of the big Safeway store on the Main Street of Marysville.

The booth will be set up and stocked on Tuesday, June 27th. This will be the afternoon for us to be trained, go over the booth security, etc. The booth has to be manned with 2 people from 9 AM to 9 PM on June 28 through July 3 and on July 4th we can start closing down and packing up in the early afternoon. We will take all the remaining fireworks to Monroe either on July 4 or July 5.

Jack Peary is the Scheduling chair for this event. Everyone will need to participate in at least one shift preferably more – check your calendar and sign up early!
