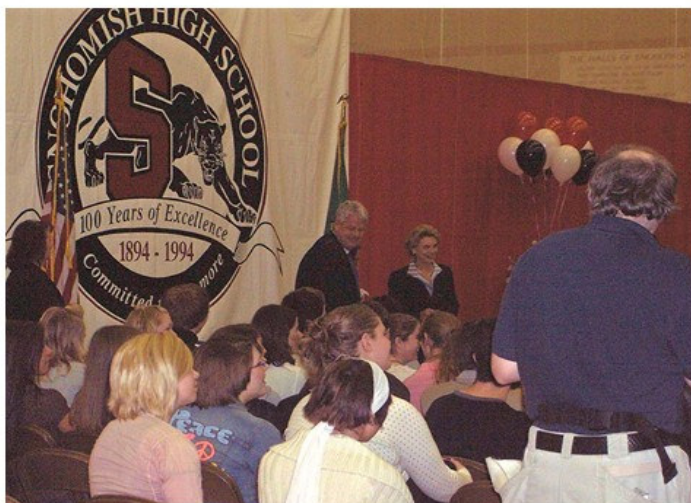

April 28, 2006 Jim Rahm

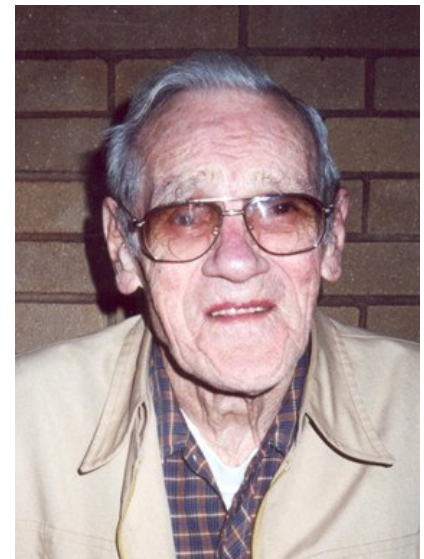

Please no more 'Postal' jokes. It certainly was not a joke on May 13, when our friendly letter carriers picked up non-perishable food packages left at mail boxes by the citizens of Snohomish County. These dedicated men and women showed us what it really means to be Postal. They worked well into late Saturday afternoon bringing the food packages back to the Post Office. There, they loaded them into large carts that hold 300 - 400 pounds of food, to be transported to the Food Bank by our truck. Once at the Food Bank, our friendly volunteers, high school students, Tillicum and Snohomish Kiwanis, and whoever unloaded the food into boxes and when we ran out of those we piled it on the floor up to the ceiling and anywhere else, as seen in the photos. Now that food, all 32,000 pounds of it, has to be segregated for distribution, so lots of volunteers are still needed.

If **University of California, Berkeley** students and faculty didn't know before what Circle K was, they certainly do now. Circle K'ers were seen all over campus during Community Service and Awareness Week, conducted this past February. All Circle K clubs are encouraged to stage daily service projects and awareness campaigns during the week, and the Berkeley Circle K'ers stepped up with several projects.

"We conducted a week of activities in the central hangout of the Berkeley campus to promote the spirit of service and to publicize Circle K," says member May Cooc. On Stress Management Day, Circle K'ers promoted health and stress awareness—and it couldn't have come at a better time. Most students on campus were engrossed in the early midterm season.



Members also made Valentine's Day cards for seniors in a retirement home, staged a campus cleanup, baked treats for a pediatric trauma prevention fundraiser, and endured a jump rope-athon. The week ended with the **California-Nevada-Hawaii District** Large Scale Service Project, when more than 50 Circle K'ers restored eroded land by planting seedlings along a hillside. By the end of the week, the Circle K'ers had logged more than 210 service hours.

"I'm always excited to promote the awesome work of Circle K International to the rest of the campus and community," says May. "Having students stop by our tables to participate or ask about Circle K was the reward of the week of events."

Dial happily ever after

What's a child to do if parents are busy, she can't yet read, and she's in serious need of a story? The **Kiwanis Club of Richland, Washington**, has that scenario covered with Dial-a-Story.

Richland Public Library manager and Kiwanis club secretary Wayne Suggs was instrumental in creating the project in 1991.

"The library did not have adequate financial resources to purchase recording equipment or story tapes," Wayne says. After presenting the idea to his club, however, the program, like its stories, concludes happily.

Since the city updated its phone system, several callers can use the service at once, and up to 200 children per month do so.

The stories, which are available 24 hours a day, change weekly and are read by Kiwanis club members who either pick one of their childhood favorites or read one chosen by the library staff.
