Lincoln City 89th PNW Convention

The PNW 89th Convention was held on August 26, 2006 at Lincoln City, Or. There were 293 clubs represented from the 7 states or provinces comprising of Alaska, Yukon, British Columbia, Washington, Idaho pan handle, Oregon, and a bit of California.

Lori Bryant was inducted as incoming Governor for the 2006-2007 year. Lori is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Puyallup and along with husband Tom operates Trophy-N-Things in Puyallup.

Rich Jansen was nominated for Governor elect for the 2007-2008 year. Rich along with his wife Marcia are members of the Kiwanis Club of Greater Tacoma (Tacoma Mall) Rich spent 30 years in the military and retired from the Army. He is a certified trainer for Kiwanis for the past three years and very active in his district.

The amendment to the district By-Laws which would allow the district to recover from each club annually the sum of \$50 to be set aside for the funding of the district convention subject to a credit to be provided against the registration fee of any member of any club attending the convention in the year in which the convention assessment is collected. This amendment passed by the majority.

The events tent displayed many articles of interest including 140 quilts that were displayed for several days and then auctioned off at the end of the Governors' Banquet. Between the sales of bottles of water and the quilts over \$2000 was raised for the Northwest Burn Camp (Camp Eyabsut) in North Bend, WA.

At the end of the Governors Banquet Governor Steve fulfilled his promise that if a goal of \$100,000 was met he would have his beard shaved off. Well the goal was reached and topped at \$140,000 and over 1600 handmade quilts.

The convention was a fun venture and a great time was had and we're looking forward to next years PNW convention in Tacoma, WA


