PROJECT STATEMENT:

Improve the status of our Service Leadership Programs District Wide.

BACKGROUND:

During the Kiwanis International training session for Service Leadership administrators in January 2007 at the American Airlines training facility in Dallas, Texas, the PNW District administrators collectively rated our district programs at that time as mediocre to good. It was decided then and there by all of us in attendance that we must raise the status of our programs from good to GREAT and do it fast.

GOVERNOR'S PROJECT GOAL:

- Increase the number of Service Leadership Programs in the District.
- Increase the number of members in our Service Leadership Programs.
- Increase the Service hours and Projects accomplished by our Service Leadership Programs.
- Increase the Kiwanis Club support to these programs both financially and physically.

CRITERIA FOR GOVERNOR'S AWARD:

To qualify a Kiwanis club must:

- a. Establish a Terrific Kids Program or the BUG Program in two or more Elementary Schools or,
- b. Establish a new K-Kids Program in an Elementary School, or
- c. Establish a new Builders program in a Middle school, or
- d. Establish a new KEY Club in a High School, or
- e. Establish a new CKI Club in a University or Jr College. Or
- f. Establish or assist in establishing a new AKTION club, or
- g. Sponsor 5 or more students to any one KEY LEADER Session.

Circle K goals mirror Kiwanis: serve children; grow (From: PNW District website)

The Circle K International Board established its goals for the 2007-08 year, emphasizing growth and service, as well as the value and impact of adding ?just one more.? Goals include:

- Spreading awareness of the new fundraising initiative, [Saving Lives](#): The Six Cents Initiative. CKI wants to raise US\$70,001 by the 2008 Circle K International Convention in Denver, Colorado, to help UNICEF to provide children with oral rehydrating salts.
- Increasing membership to 14,000?plus one, a 6 percent increase.
- Increasing service hours to 450,000?plus one, a 32.1 hours-per-member increase.
- Increasing active clubs to 504, an increase of 31 clubs.
- Being mission- and vision-focused in all CKI decision-making
