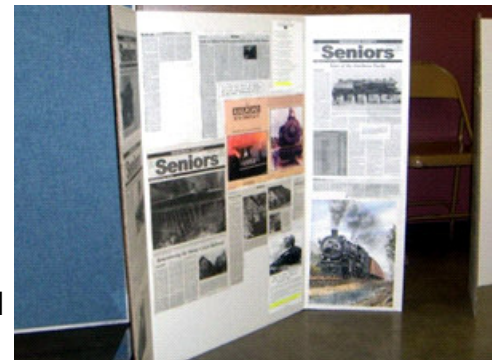
2007 Zone conference in BC

Question: What is the KiwanisOne portal?

Answer: Referred to as the "member portal," KiwanisOne is a set of resources grouped together to improve the member experience and make us more effective Kiwanians. Some resources are still under development; use the search function in top right to quickly find what you need.

IMPORTANT! The [old Kiwanis site](#) is still available for a very limited time, but all relevant Kiwanian resources will be migrated over by April 15, 2008 and this URL will no longer exist after that date. Please remember that this old site is no longer updated and is just a resource for items that have not moved to KiwanisOne yet.

Online Reporting - Currently, annual club reports, monthly reports, club election report and change in meeting reports are in use. Go to kiwanisone.org/login to log in. If you are not reporting online, and your district participates in the KiwanisOne reporting, follow the same link above to register. All Kiwanis reporting will eventually be done through KiwanisOne.

Member Resources - All relevant, updated and new Kiwanis member material, how-tos, and key messages have relocated from the classic site (formerly Member area) to this tab of the KiwanisOne portal. Please search nav links at right to access resources and links to downloads for all your daily Kiwanis business. "Guest" resources remain on the public relations Web site - kiwanis.org - to tell the Kiwanis mission and story to the general public, media, and hopefully, prospective Kiwanians.

Kiwanis Leader - A place for leaders and leaders-in-training. We welcome users from inside and outside the Kiwanis family to browse and use these resources.

Club Management System - Kiwanis International and Club Resource, LLC, have partnered to make a Web-based club management system available to all clubs. A fee-based subscription includes event management tools, newsletter creator, secretary tools, public Web site, and much more.
