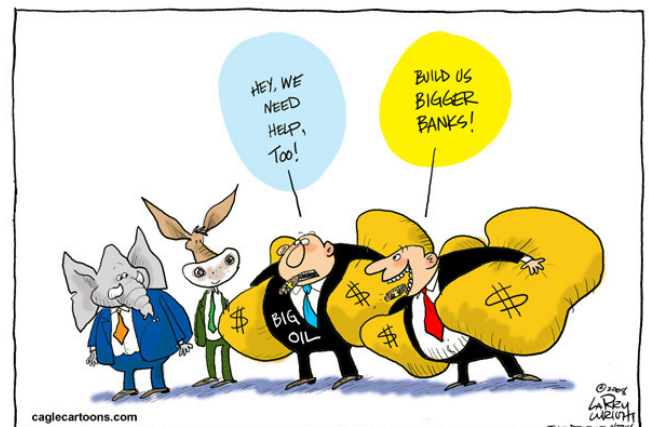

1. Any/All club officers now may serve either one-year or two-year terms, as determined by each club.
2. Clubs now have the option to use electronic balloting methods to elect officers.
