Each leaving with unique memories and some individuals come back as counselors, giving back to Camp I-VY.

FOUNDATION: Eight members from the Kiwanis Club of Mukilteo attended the Foundation Breakfast.

FOUNDATION ENJOYS A SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISING EVENT. The early returns indicate that the Mukilteo Schools Foundation raised almost \$40,000 during its annual fundraising breakfast held last week. The event featured a presentation by Garth Stein, the author of the best-selling book *The Art of Racing in the Rain*. Proceeds from the event will be used to purchase the My World of Science library, the Bug Books library and additional books for science kits for each 2nd grade classroom in the school district, as well as the Wild Weather library and the Plant library for 1st grade classrooms. Proceeds also will fund classroom teacher grants, scholarships for graduating seniors and a portion of a subscription for a service called Opposing Viewpoints, which is used in secondary libraries. The event was sponsored by The Boeing Company, Klein Honda, Paragon Manufacturing, Sodexo, Verizon, The Sayko Agency for Farmer's Insurance, McKinstry, Puget Sound Energy, Third Place Books and Vicki Derks Photography.
